Objectives: This lesson is intended to familiarize you with the names of various tools and their uses. You'll get some practice talking about them and how they're used.

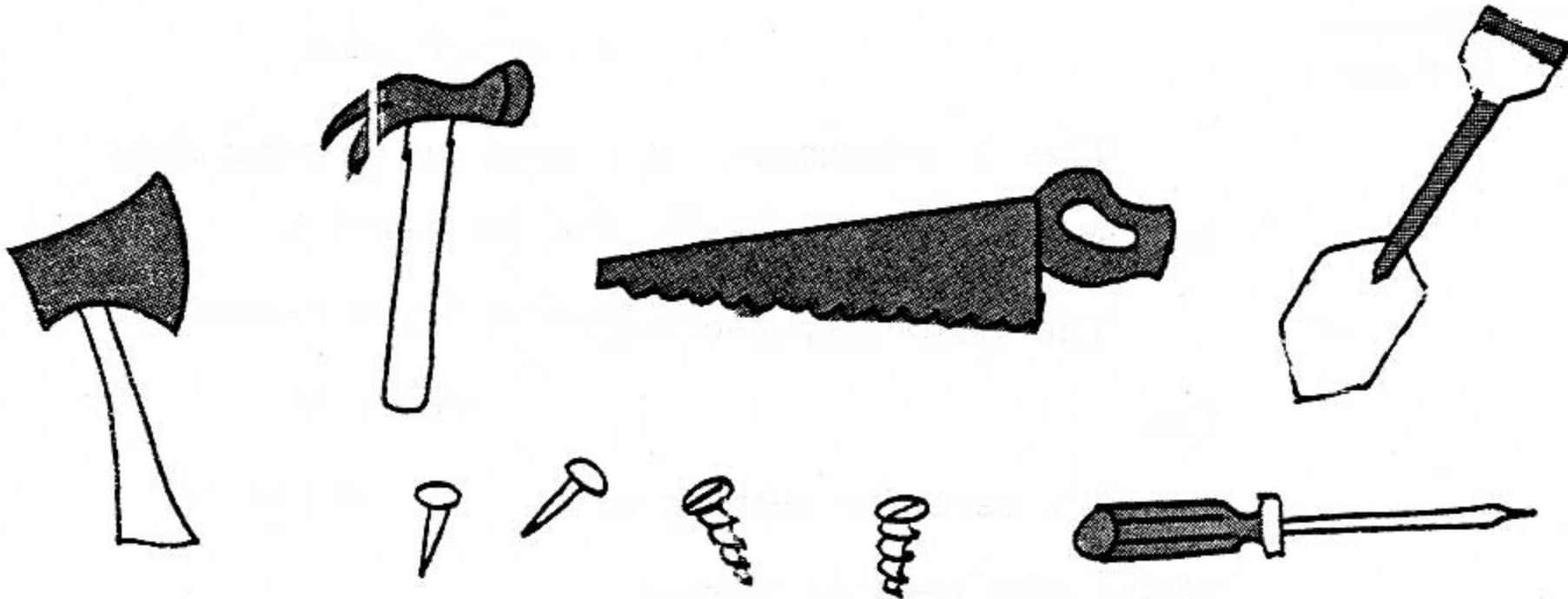
